Who is this course for?

The General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) is the official examination which completes High School education in the UK. GCSEs are recognised worldwide and are the ideal gateway to further academic study in the UK. The programme at Kings can be studied as an accelerated 3-term option or as a standard 4 – 6 term programme (Bournemouth only).

Course structure

At Kings we offer two study plans:

- → an accelerated one-year course in Bournemouth, Brighton, London and Oxford
- → a standard course of between 4 6 terms in Bournemouth


Students will follow a mixed curriculum including science, mathematics and humanities subjects. They can expect to prepare for GCSE exams in a range of subjects, depending on aptitude and language proficiency.

Subjects include: Arts, Business, English, Geography, History, Information Technology, Mathematics, PSHE, Science and Physical Education. There is also the opportunity for students to participate in a range of extracurricular activities. See each school for more detailed information.

Students on the Accelerated and Standard study plans study the same subjects and attend the same number of total taught lessons per week but the distribution of the lessons changes. The table below shows a breakdown of the lessons per week by subject.

Mentoring and support

International students under the age of 16 must have a UK-based guardian when they come to study in the United Kingdom.

All students of 14+ are automatically allocated our Homestay Extra service for the highest levels of comfort and support.

- → Large, single, well-furnished bedroom
- → Television in student's room

Social, cultural and sports activities outside class
