

Brock Heritage

When you choose Brockenhurst College you are choosing to belong to a proud history of academic excellence that spans more than a century. Here is a decade-by-decade summary of how we became the unique learning institution we are today.

1910s

The organisation that became Brockenhurst College began as a small pupil-teacher centre with 18 pupils in 1913. The first long-term Headteacher was the formidable Miss Emma Clara Ward, whose attention to detail, emphasis on discipline and focus on high-level achievement, quickly translated into good exam results.



1920s

A good reputation saw pupil numbers surge to 155 by 1921, and it was not long before the pupil-teacher centre was renamed Brockenhurst County School. By the mid-1920s the new school had a hall, gym, kitchen and woodwork room. Momentum was building.



1930s

In the early 1930s the grand sum of £32,000 was spent on improving the school's facilities. Miss Ward worked to improve educational provision until her death in 1935. She was succeeded by Mr R.H. May, who aimed to modernise learning and broaden pupils' horizons through visiting lecturers and trips abroad.



1940s

Wartime saw an Air Training Corps, Girls Training Corps and an Army Cadet Force formed at the School. Despite the upheaval, exam results remained good, and by 1949 pupil numbers has reached 700. Dr L.R. Wood took over as Headteacher in 1949. Among other things, he introduced a focus on career planning.



1950s

By the 1950s the village of Brockenhurst was home to the largest grammar school in the country, with more than 1,000 pupils. Headteacher Dr L.R. Wood introduced the motto 'Inter Silvas Quaerere Verum' (to seek truth amidst the trees), which remains to this day.



1960s

In 1961 the School was educating 1,130 pupils and was rated highly. Her Majesty's Inspectorate noted in its report: 'This is plainly a good school both in the general standard of its academic work and in the quality of its life.' In 1969 decision-makers opted to phase out the lower school.

1970s

As Brockenhurst Sixth Form College was established, a new Headteacher took over. Mr A.J. Baker placed emphasis on young people's role in society and the development of a social conscience. By the middle of the decade the College taught post-16 learners only. This education was provided by right and not by selection.



1980s

In 1984 the ever-expanding College finally became known as Brockenhurst College. Importantly, it would now allow students to select from a wide range of subjects instead of only the standard curriculum subjects. Later in the 1980s it merged with the Central New Forest Adult Education Institute. Mr. M.J. Snell became Principal in 1989.



1990s

The 1990s was a time of major investment at Brock, with a series of building programmes undertaken. There were also many curriculum innovations, including the introduction of educational provision for adults with learning difficulties and the incorporation of three more adult learning institutes into the College.

2010s – Present Day

Since 2010 Brock's facilities have expanded even further, with the opening of a new STEM Centre in 2016. There is also now an enhanced focus on progression and employability. The College remains a leading force in education locally and consistently records exam results that exceed the national average.

2000s

With the new millennium came further investment in Brock's facilities. The £3.5m Beacon Technology Centre, serving IT, Technology, Media and Photography courses, was officially opened in 2004. In the same year, Ofsted rated the College as 'Outstanding'. Current Principal Mrs. D. Roberts CBE was appointed in 2006.



Teaching & Results

A UK education is recognised by many employers, universities and governments around the world as an indication of quality in a young person. Studying with us will give you the knowledge and skills on which you can build for success in the future, as well as an authentic British experience.

Excellent results

Our exam results are consistently high. In 2018 our overall pass rate was 99%, with 82% of international students achieving A*-C grades across all subjects. Detailed exam results for 2018 are available at www.brock.ac.uk/achievements

Secure a place at a top university

All our international students can progress to a top university. In 2018 41% of international students who went to a UK university from Brockenhurst College gained places at top 10* ranked universities, including: Imperial College London, University College London, London School of Economics and University of Edinburgh.

We are one of very few colleges in the country to have achieved accreditation for all areas of our work.

Location

The UK is well-known around the world for its wealth of different communities, historical landmarks and world-class cultural events. Here in the South you can enjoy a mix of cosmopolitan cities, country villages and the New Forest National Park with its ancient woodland and free-roaming ponies, donkeys and cattle.

Our 36-acre campus is on the coastal side of the New Forest, and is a friendly, safe and peaceful environment in which to learn. Brockenhurst village is a five-minute walk away and has a mainline train station, enabling you to travel to London in under two hours.

Fifteen minutes away by train is the Russell Group university city of Southampton, which is also one of the largest shopping destinations in the region. In the opposite direction is the famous seaside resort town of Bournemouth.

Travel and transport

Travelling to the College is easy thanks to excellent transport links. Importantly, we try to ensure all host families live close to public transport routes.

Southampton and Bournemouth both have international airports serving European destinations, and cross-channel ferries run from Poole and Portsmouth.



Academic support

You will benefit from high-quality teaching staff who have an in-depth knowledge of exam requirements. All our teachers are specialists within their subjects and many have professional experience in their fields. They strive to inspire and motivate you to achieve your full potential.

International tutorial programme

When you arrive you will be given a full induction to help you settle. Regular international tutorials are timetabled, giving you access to both academic and pastoral help and support.

English classes (ESOL)

Your timetable will include ESOL English classes to help support your UK learning experience. All top universities in the UK and overseas require a high level of English, which is why these classes can aid you in both the short and longer-term. We also offer specific exam preparation support qualifications such as IELTS and TOEFL.

Student Support Manager (SSM)

Your SSM will provide you with a friendly point of contact for academic and personal issues. They will provide you with information about events, your progression and if you are staying in the UK for your further studies will help with your UCAS application. They are focused on enabling you to reach your full potential.

University and careers guidance

There will be opportunities to visit universities and attend our Higher Education Fair on campus, which is attended by representatives of around 70 universities. You can also receive guidance about the process of applying to universities in the UK, including the universities of Oxford and Cambridge. In addition, you will have access one-to-one careers advice as part of our Next Steps programme.

Brock Elite programme

The Brock Elite programme is a specialist added-value service that is designed to help students achieve their potential. It is a total-care package that provides an extra layer of support and encouragement to enable students to adapt to the UK education system smoothly. It runs with both our Pre-A Level Plus courses and our full A Level courses. You may choose to participate in the programme for one or two years.

As a student on the Brock Elite programme you will benefit from the following:

- A specialist Elite Tutor to focus on your academic needs.
- Access to additional academic support outside normal college hours.
- Regular written feedback to your parents on your performance and attendance.
- A termly video link update to your parents.
- Frequent progress reviews and constant monitoring by your Elite Tutor.

- Extra pastoral care from dedicated officers.
- Access to our Aspire programme to help you aim for places at top universities.

Aspire Academy

Our Aspire Academy is about nurturing your abilities and giving you the academic support you need to fulfil your potential. You will also benefit from university outreach initiatives, field trips, Enrichment opportunities, summer school options and inter-college competitions.

How to apply

You can apply for our Aspire Academy at enrolment. As an Aspire student we will expect you to follow relevant Enrichment opportunities of your choice. We will also encourage you to become a Student Ambassador, which will help you develop your public-speaking skills and confidence.

Oxbridge support

We have dedicated Oxbridge tutor groups for STEM and humanities to help you make a successful application to the college of your choice. We provide interactive workshops to help you develop your skills of critical thinking, prepare you for selection interviews and extend your learning beyond the classroom.

Throughout the year we provide specialist support and guidance, including seminars run by representatives of Oxbridge universities.

Aspire tutoring

Each year 42% of our Aspire students progress to Russell Group universities. We have collaborative projects with Oxford and Cambridge, and also the more local universities of Southampton, Bournemouth, Reading and Winchester, to help you make a successful transition to higher education.

As an Aspire student you will be in a specialised tutor group to help you develop and consolidate your knowledge and skills, as well as grow both in confidence and as a person.

University applications

We aim to prepare you for the rigorous application, testing and interview processes of the country's most respected universities.

Masterclasses

These are interactive workshops led by Oxbridge tutors with the involvement of the Principal. They are designed to help you develop your skills of critical thinking, prepare you for selection interviews and extend your learning beyond the classroom.

Medical Matters

These are weekly meetings for students who aspire to work in the medical professions. Expert advice and guidance will be provided on how to make a successful application and you will discuss and debate current issues in medicine.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award is a multi-discipline activity that runs at three levels (Bronze, Silver and Gold). We can fully support and organise expeditions for Bronze and Silver levels. We can also support Gold level and put you

STEP and AEA Maths support

We provide individual and small group support to students wishing to sit STEP, AEA and other special exams. Support will involve taught sessions in the lead-up to exams, as well as access to a range of practice materials and other resources on our e-learning website. You will also be given access to a wide range of support materials through the Further Maths Support programme and Integral Maths website.

Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)

The EPQ gives you the opportunity to research an area of your choice beyond your A Level courses. It is equivalent to one AS Level (UCAS points) and can be studied in your second year.

It will develop your academic skills through the process of planning and refining your research to make a final presentation. Your project can be either a research project or an artefact such as a piece of music or film script.

You will be taught and mentored in small groups. Every year students complete scientific and social science-based projects. Past projects have included: The impact of pesticides on bee populations; Is the NHS being privatised by stealth?; Existentialism in the work of Dostoyevsky; Women in Victorian society.

STEM Academy

At Brockenhurst College we have a long history of strong results across the STEM subjects. In fact, almost 52% of our STEM students have progressed to Russell Group universities in recent years.

How do I apply?

You will have the opportunity to apply at enrolment.

What are the advantages?

Our STEM Academy is designed to support students studying science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM), and promote high achievement.

So if you are considering a career in science, engineering, medicine, veterinary science, or any other STEM-related area, then this opportunity to gain added support for your learning is definitely one for you.

Special activities

Being part of our STEM Academy means you will have opportunities to participate in extra activities including competitions, trips and talks by visiting speakers.

Here are some examples of recent opportunities:

- British Science Week with a range of visiting speakers.
- Community volunteer programme for medics and vets.
- Educational trips to Iceland, Switzerland (CERN) and elsewhere.
- Medical Matters Enrichment.
- Physics and Biology Challenges and Olympiads.
- Robotics Club.
- Subject conferences.
- Support with special papers like BMAT, MAT and STEP.
- UK Senior Maths Challenges (Individual and Team) and Olympiad.
- University of Southampton Ambassadors' programme.

What is the commitment?

If you join the STEM Academy we will expect you to participate in at least one relevant Enrichment activity and go on at least one extended trip of your choice during your first year.

HOMESTAY accommodation

You will be welcomed into your new home and, importantly, be treated as a member of the family.

Homestay accommodation is available to all international students and is organised by the College's International Office. You will live with a local British host and gain a realistic insight into British life. All our hosts are selected carefully and inspected regularly.

Homestay accommodation provides:

- A traditional, English-speaking home environment.
- A private furnished room.
- Two meals a day, and three meals a day during weekends and holidays.
- Internet access.
- Travel pass, where applicable.*
- Laundry opportunities once or twice a week.
- Proximity to the College based a commute of 30 minutes.
- Very few additional living costs.

We aim to provide a safe and supported transition to living in the UK. Your homestay host will give you advice about staying healthy and safe while you gradually become more independent. You will be able to call them at any time for support, and there is also a 24-hour College Helpline in case of emergencies. Your homestay host can also provide reassurance about your progress to your parents.
