Find the best programme for you

A Level – A Levels are British qualifications, accepted by all universities in the UK and recognised in the USA and Australia. Students typically study three or four subjects with exams at the end of two years. [More on page 16.](#)

Foundation – A one-year programme for international students, accredited by Lancaster University, which builds specialist subject knowledge and language skills. It is more focused than A Levels, making it good preparation for university. [More on page 26.](#)

Pre-Foundation – A one-year programme preparing you for a selection of Foundation pathways. A six month (2 term) programme is available for students aged over 18 years. Develop your English language and academic skills, and complete project work related to your chosen pathway. [More on page 32.](#)

3 and 4 Term GCSE – This 3 or 4 term programme is a fast track to our A Level or Foundation programme. You will study up to six GCSE subjects, including English and Mathematics. [More on page 34.](#)

2 Year GCSE Pathway – A two-year programme where students typically study nine GCSE subjects between the ages of 14 and 16. We recommended subjects that will suit your interests and goals, preparing you for the A Level programme. [More on page 33.](#)

Undergraduate Year 1 – A one-year programme, developed in close partnership with Aston University, that is equivalent to the first year of an undergraduate degree. Taught in London, this programme prepares students for the second year of a business-related degree at one of 20+ UK universities. [More on page 36.](#)

High School Term – Experience one or two terms of a British education (GCSE or A Level) and earn academic credits towards your studies back home. [More on bellerbys.com.](#)

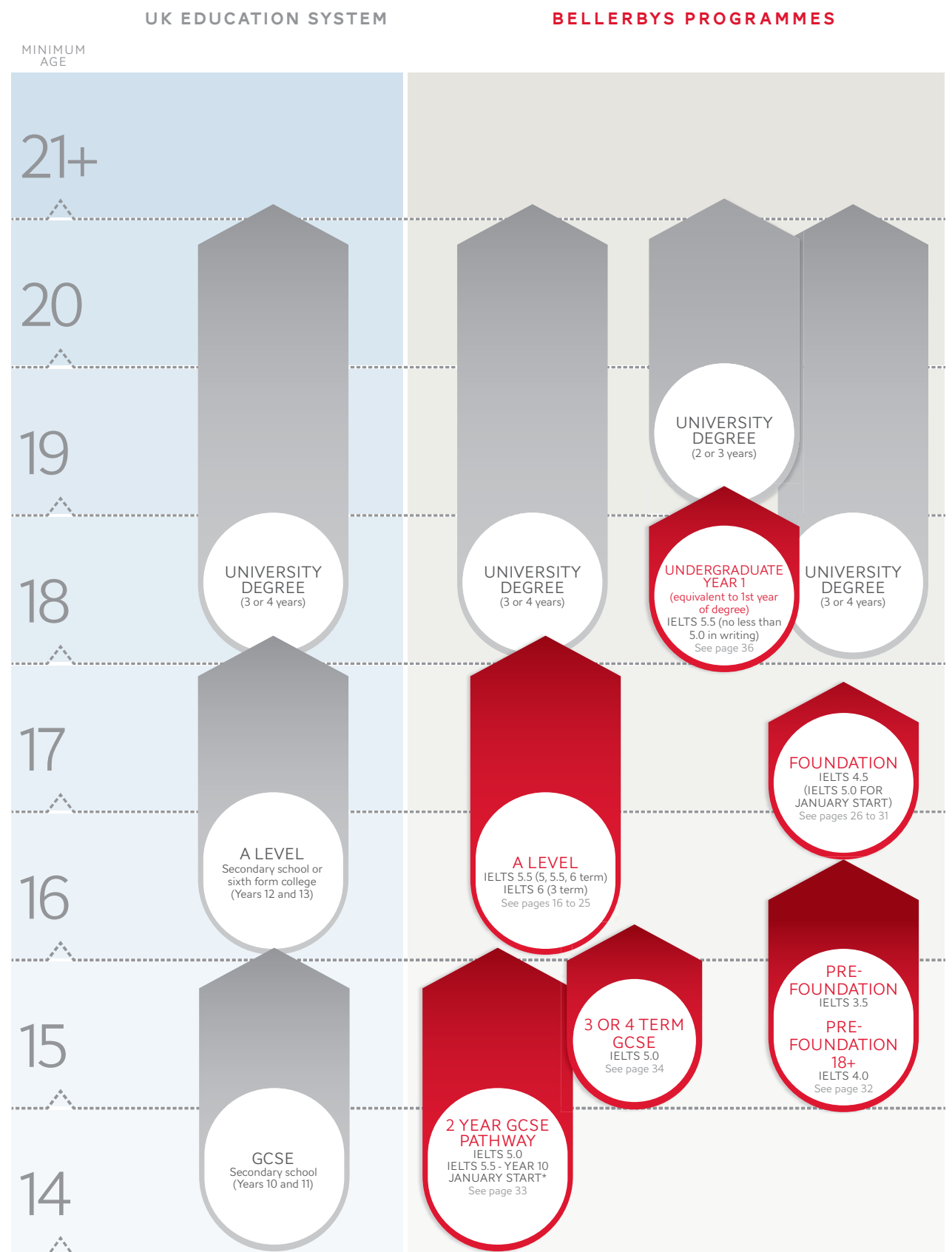

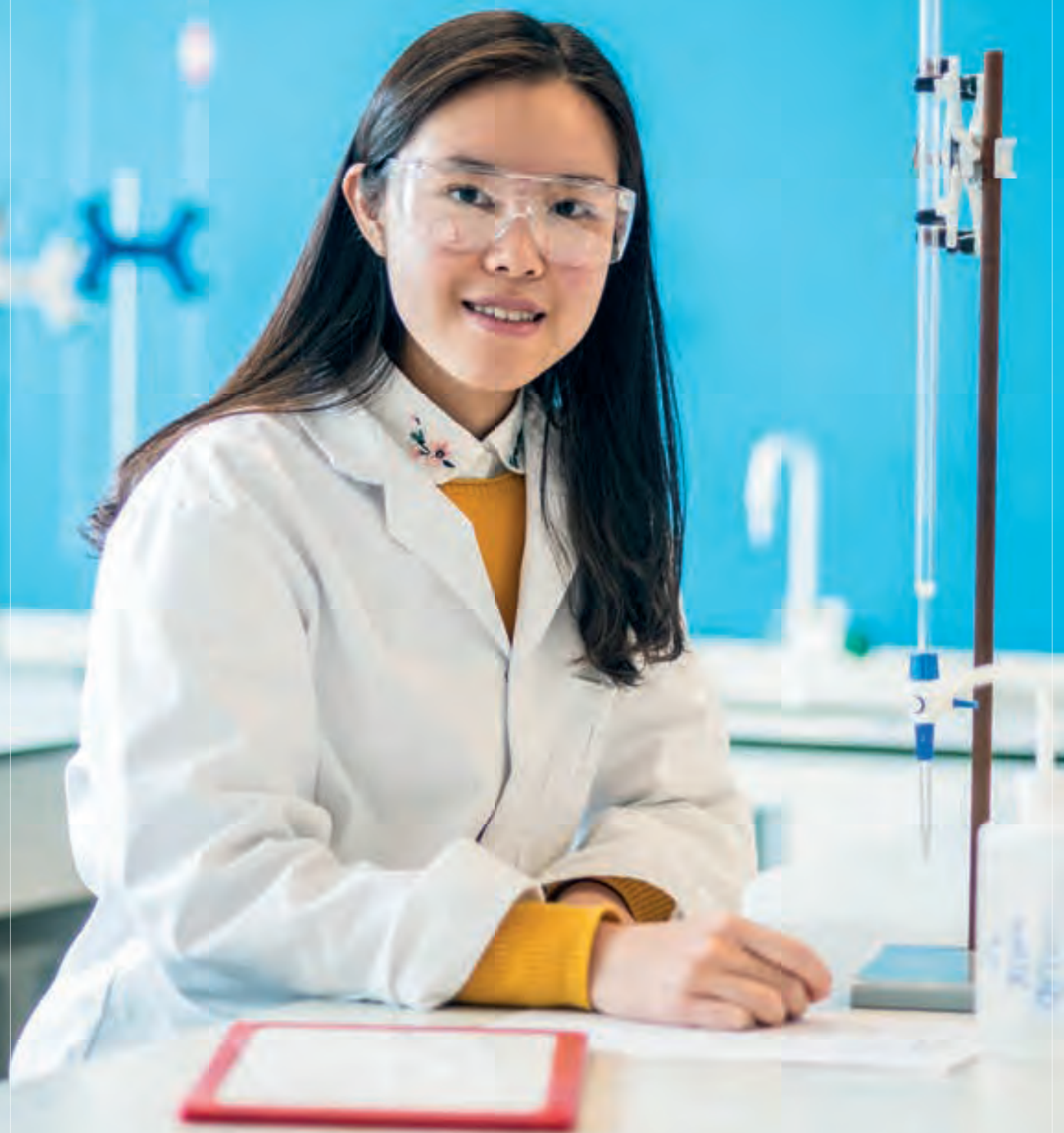

International A Levels at Bellerbys Cambridge

International A Levels are qualifications aimed specifically at international students like you, and they are a great option to help you gain a deep understanding of your subjects. Our International A Levels are governed by Cambridge Assessment International Education, part of the University of Cambridge. International A Levels include:

- **AS examinations in June or November**, at the end of your first year, which is particularly suited to science subjects where learning is modular
- The opportunity to study for an **Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)**.

Students will study between 21 and 26.5 hours each week. This includes:

- 5.5 hours of teaching time (per subject) – this is increased to over 6 hours for January starters
- 1.5 hours minimum laboratory time (increased dependent upon previous practical experience)
- 3 hours intensive tailored English support (focused upon relevant science vocabulary)
- 45 minute tutorial.

A2 A Level entry at Bellerbys Cambridge

Students who have achieved **a minimum of three B grades** or above at AS Level CIE (Cambridge International A Level) are able to join the second year (A2), 3 term A Level programme starting in September. This is subject to an IELTS of at least 6.0 and a successful interview with the Bellerbys Cambridge Principal.

GCSE

2 Year GCSE Pathway

Students typically study nine GCSE subjects with exams taken at the end of two years. You can choose one of five academic pathways depending upon your interests and university ambitions.

Added support for young students

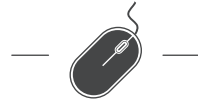

GCSE

3 or 4 terms

Join our 3 or 4 term GCSE programme and study the core subjects needed for A Level or Foundation study.

Pre-GCSE

Preparation for your GCSE programme

This course is for students who want to join the 3 term GCSE course but who do not have the required IELTS level 5.0. Students who join this course are usually 14 or 15 years of age.

How long is the programme?

The programme can be anything from 1 to 3 terms, depending on abilities. You can then progress to either the 3 term GCSE programme, September or January start.

What will I study?

Each week you will receive up to 15 hours of English language studies to help improve your language skills, and a further 15 hours of core subject classes including Mathematics, ICT, Art, Science, Business Studies, PSHE and PE.

Additional support

For many Pre-GCSE students, coming to Bellerbys is their first experience away from home. Our classes run for the whole day and students receive close supervision under the care of a personal tutor, who monitors both social and academic progress. 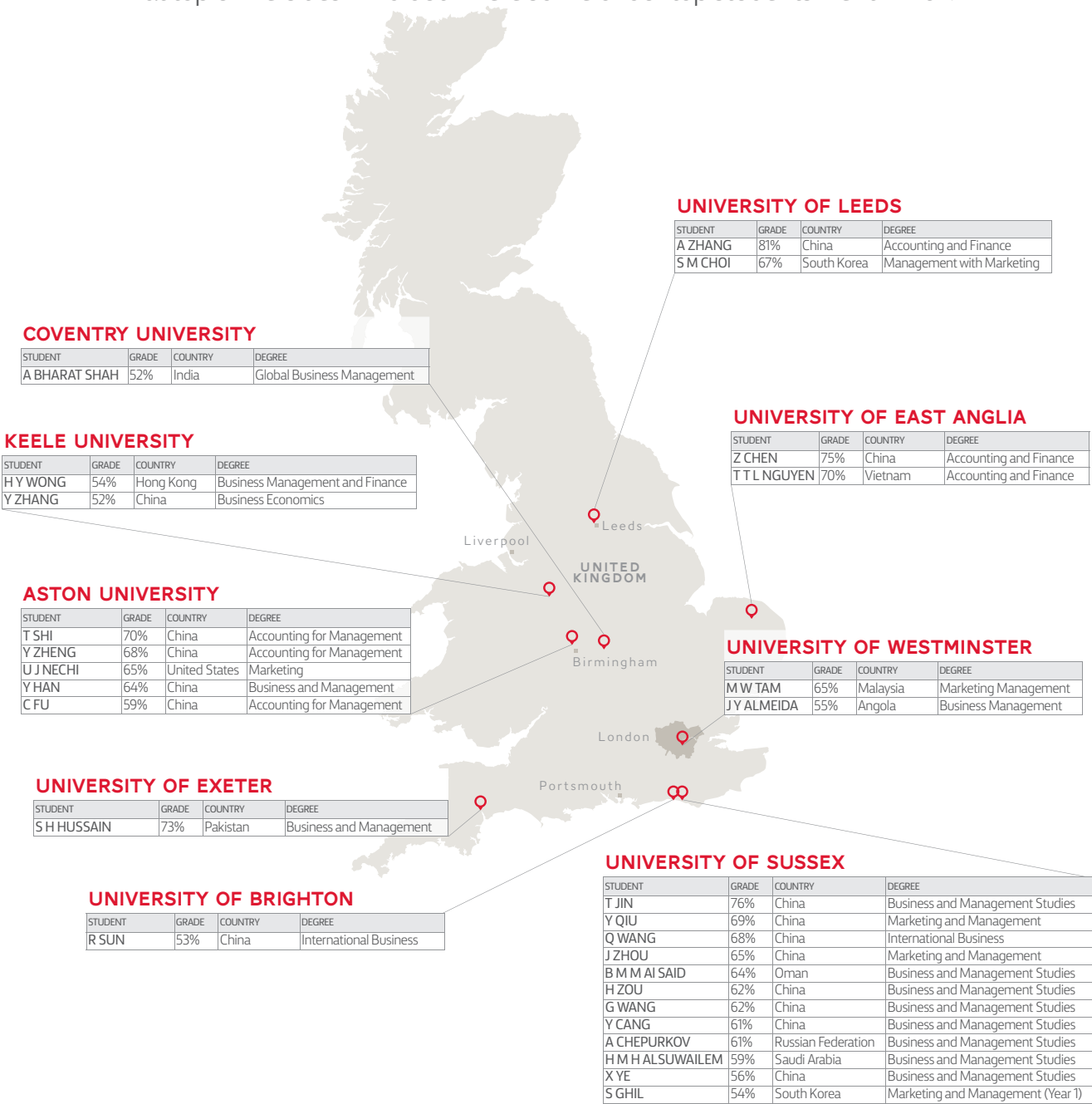

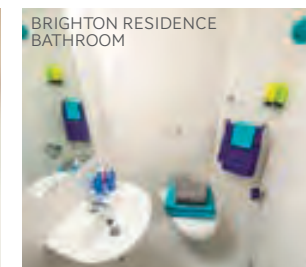

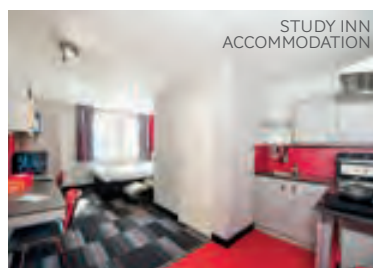

Most of our students choose to live on campus in the McMillan Student Village. You will be close to the College and can easily explore the maritime heritage and riverside landscapes of nearby Greenwich.

McMillan Student Village

The McMillan Student Village is next to the College; a one minute walk to where you will be studying. You will live with students from the University of Greenwich and Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance, as well as your classmates from Bellerbys College London.

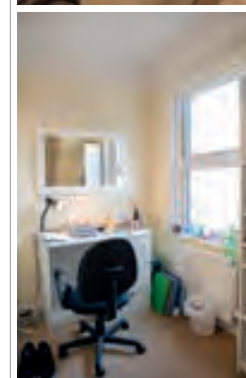

Homestay

Living in a homestay is a great way to experience life in Britain. By living with a local family, you can learn more about British life and culture. You will also improve your English levels through casual conversation.



Selecting your homestay

Students who select homestay as an option are matched to a suitable host when we receive your application. Any known preferences, such as if the household has pets, are taken into consideration. Students have the opportunity to request an alternative allocation at this stage prior to their arrival.

Once you arrive (during induction), Student Services will check that you are happy with your homestay. A member of the team will visit the homestay as soon as possible if you have any concerns regarding the accommodation, cleanliness or the facilities offered.

Types of homestay:

- **Standard homestay.** If you are at least 16 years old and would like to live independently, but with the support of a caring home environment.
- **Homestay Plus.** If you are aged 13 to 15 years old, Homestay Plus provides extra support and supervision to ensure that you are safe and secure in your homestay.

Both options include:

- Comfortable study bedroom with a desk and wardrobe
- Breakfast and evening meals
- Weekly laundry
- Bedding and towels
- Wi-Fi and telephone access
- Support from the College Welfare Team

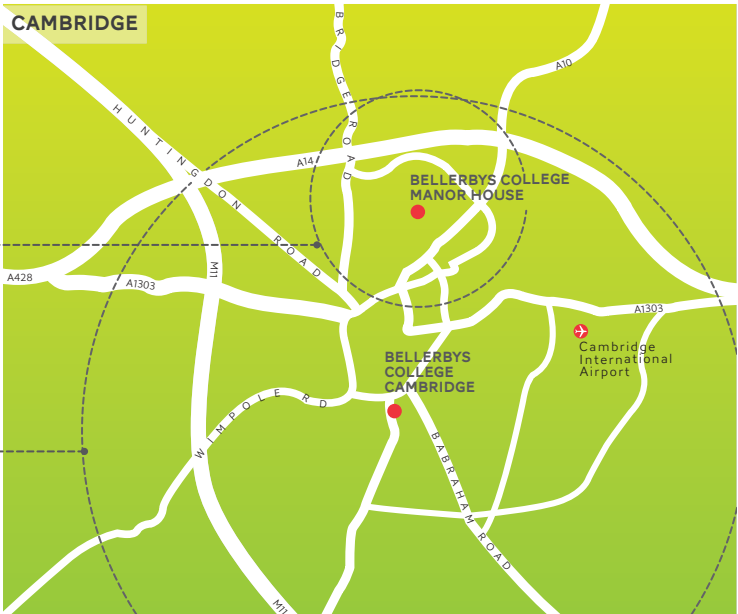

Host Family selection

Our homestays are local people who have free space in their homes and want to help international students settle into UK life. Your host will help you gain a deeper understanding of living in the UK, whilst you teach them more about your own culture.

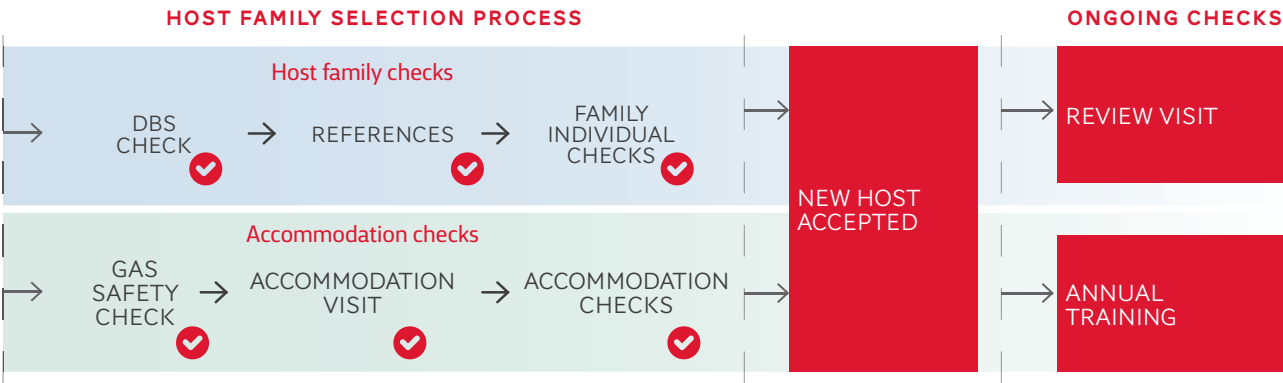
We complete a secure background check on all of our hosts, which includes:

- A DBS check (criminal record check) for every member of the household over the age of 16.
- Interview with host parents.
- Home visit to assess the quality of the accommodation and student bedroom.
- Character references.
- Proof of safety compliance with documents such as gas certificates.

Ongoing checking procedure

Once a year, our hosts are visited by an Accommodation Officer to ensure the College standards are maintained. All hosts must complete a Child Protection training course, as well as show an understanding of our policies on keeping students safe. In addition to this, our hosts will attend training sessions with our Director of Student Services once a year.

Most of our homestays are located less than 30 minutes' walk from the Colleges, or a short bus journey away. Your host may be a home with children, a single person or a home with other students.



Please note: Homestay in London is only available for students who are aged 16 or older.
All 2 Year GCSE Pathway students in Brighton must live on campus.
