

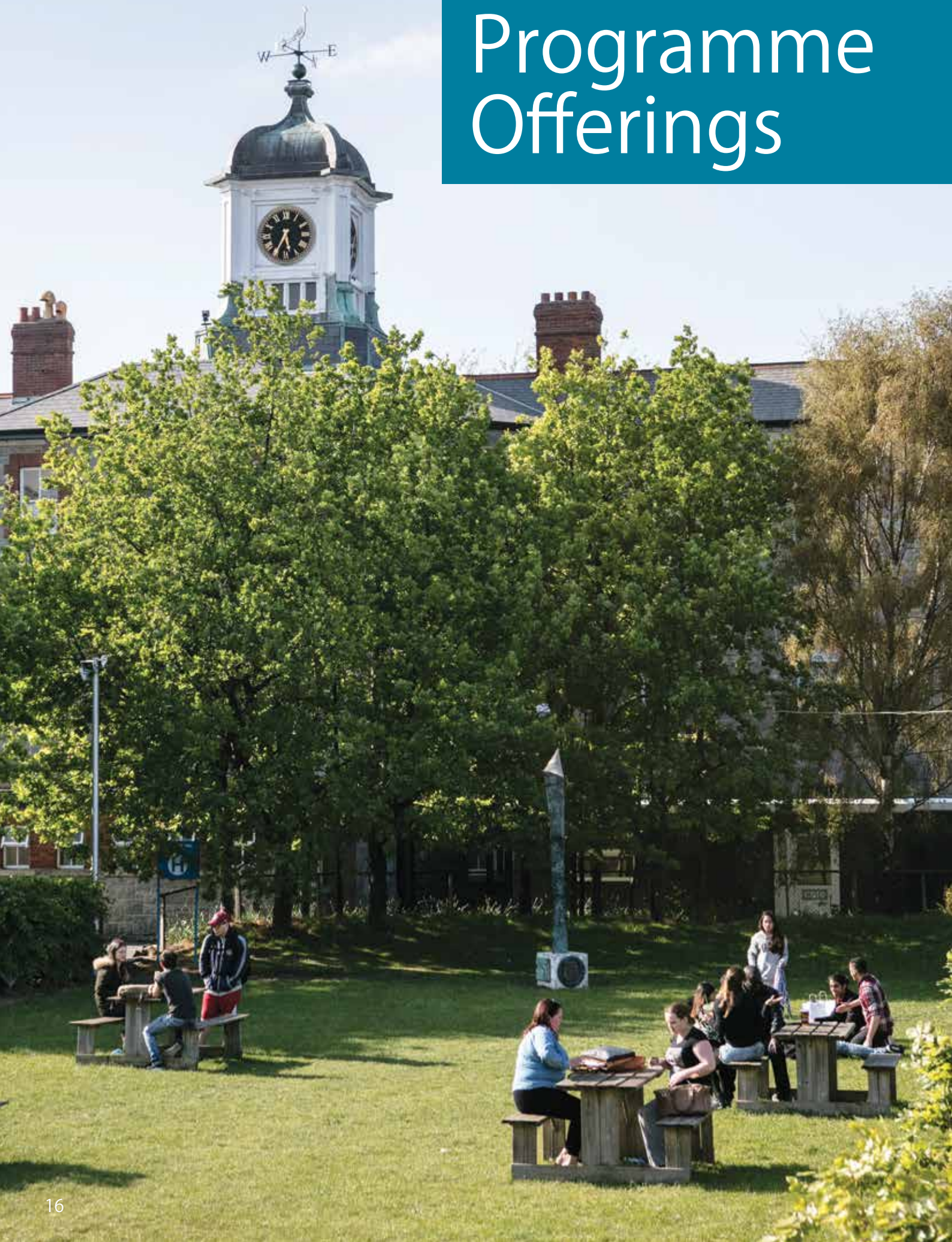

## \*English for Academic Purposes (EAP)

English for Academic Purposes (**EAP**) is the latest innovative language programme being offered by Griffith College for those students wanting to gain entry onto an academic course within the college but who have not yet achieved the required English language level.

EAP is available for all students who have an IELTS 4.0 and above or equivalent. The course runs for 45 weeks in its entirety. It is structured in 5 week blocks with different entry points throughout the year. In total there are nine 5 week blocks. Students will join the course in line with the IELTS score or equivalent.

For example, a student with a score of 4.0 will start at the beginning while a student with a higher score will start later in the course depending on their level. The students will be assessed by continuous assessment throughout the course ending with an external IELTS examination. Learners will be introduced to a range of Academic English language structures and conventions, required to develop their confidence in the use of English for Academic Purposes. Learners are challenged to think autonomously, critically and develop their understanding of the materials.

## **EAP has four principal aims.**

1. Prepare international learners for university courses conducted through the medium of English.
2. Provide these learners with the necessary independent learning, communication and study skills to help them adapt to studying in a western university study environment.
3. Provide learners with the core language competencies of listening, speaking, reading and writing in the English language and the confidence and ability to interact in an English speaking academic community, using appropriate language and form.

4. Ability to work both autonomously and cooperatively.

The course syllabus integrates skills and language work and builds on presentation skills with a focus on academic writing that refers to background reading. EAP is a new and exciting course which will appeal to those students with the ambition to improve their English level along with acquiring key academic skills. It is a challenging but extremely rewarding experience. We look forward to welcoming new students.

# Elective Choices

## **The Language of Journalism**

This elective is designed to develop English language use in journalistic contexts. You will focus on developing key journalistic competencies across the four core language skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing.

This development will be set in the context of current social, economic and political issues in Ireland, Europe and beyond.

## **Business English**

This elective is designed to develop language use in business contexts. You will focus on gaining a wide-ranging overview of the business world. You will also acquire key communication skills that are necessary for professional situations and further studies within the field.

## **Exam Preparation (IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge)**

This elective is designed to develop effective exam strategies and testing skills in the context of core language skills development. The learner will prepare for externally accredited examinations such as IELTS, TOEFL and the Cambridge suite of examinations. The learner will develop the core skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing as well as a clear understanding of the rubric of the chosen examination. They will also focus on the different task types and questions that may be presented, employing effective task completion and timekeeping strategies to give the best chance of exam success.

\* All electives are subject to minimum number of 7 students enrolling on the programme.



# Exam Preparation Programmes

## IELTS

The International English Language Testing System, is a testing system designed to assess the language ability of candidates who need to work or study where English is the language of communication.

IELTS is one of the most commonly used assessments for English language proficiency.

It is recognised by universities, employers, professional bodies, immigration authorities and other government agencies across the world.

In Griffith Institute of Language, we offer two different IELTS preparation programmes.

## IELTS Intensive

*For those who wish to have more intensive IELTS preparation, we offer a 20-hour programme over 12 weeks.*

### IELTS PROGRAMME CONTENT

Both the Intensive IELTS programme and the modular IELTS programme are designed to develop effective exam strategies and testing skills. Learners will focus on clearly understanding the rubric of the IELTS exam, and the different task types and questions that may be presented. They will also focus on employing effective task completion and timekeeping strategies to give them the best chance.

## HOST FAMILY ACCOMMODATION

Arriving in a new country can be a daunting experience, but getting a true Irish welcome from one of our host families will make you feel like you are in a home from home. It is also great way to improve your English and learn about Irish culture and life.

## ON-CAMPUS ACCOMMODATION

Griffith Halls of Residence is a development of student accommodation built in two blocks. It comprises 165 apartments that provide accommodation for over 600 students. The majority of the apartments contain two shared bedrooms and a shared living space. There are also a number of single rooms available in shared apartments. Each two-bedroom apartment has two bathrooms, one of which is en-suite. There is 24-hour security, free internet access and laundry facilities. Self-catering and full board options are also available.

## OUR RECRUITMENT AND INSPECTION POLICIES

At Griffith we have a policy of recruiting families, in safe and secure areas, with high quality houses. We inspect all of our families against a set of national standards, as well as some additional standards that we have added ourselves. In the interests of safety and in line with our accreditation standards, all of our families are vetted by An Garda Síochána – the Irish police service.

# Frequently Asked Questions

## WHERE ARE YOU LOCATED?

Griffith College Dublin is located on the South Circular Road; it is about a 20-minute walk to Dublin city centre and 10 minutes to the Luas, Dublin's tram service. There is also a regular bus service to and from the city centre.

Griffith College Cork is located on Wellington Road, just moments away from the main shopping and cultural districts of Cork City.

Griffith College Limerick is centrally located in Limerick city on O'Connell Avenue.

## HOW DO I GET THERE FROM THE AIRPORT?

You can take a taxi, which will cost you about €40 - €50. There is the bus number 16A which brings you very close to the College and there are public buses to the city centre from where you can take a taxi. We also offer a transfer service for €80, where the College Driver will collect you from the terminal building and bring you to your destination.

## WHAT HAPPENS ON MY FIRST DAY?

Every English language student completes an English language placement test, which determines your level and allows us to place you in the most appropriate class. We then give an induction as well as a campus tour to ensure that you have all of the information that you need. You will begin your lessons on your second day with us.

## HOW MANY CLASS LEVELS DO YOU HAVE?

We can guarantee 5 levels, Elementary, Pre-Intermediate, Intermediate, Upper Intermediate and Advanced.

## WHO WILL BE IN MY CLASS?

You will have a variety of nationalities in your class, from Europe, Asia, South America and the Middle East. The ages will vary from 16 to 34 and there will be a mix of male and female learners.

## HOW MANY STUDENTS WILL BE IN MY CLASS?

There will be no more than 15 students in a class and typically there are 10 - 12.

## I HAVE ALLERGIES AND I CANNOT STAY IN A HOST FAMILY WITH PETS. CAN YOU FIND ME A HOST FAMILY WITHOUT PETS?

Absolutely, just indicate on your application form (or separately by email) your preferred accommodation requirements and we will do our best to meet your needs.

## IF I THINK THE CLASS IS THE WRONG LEVEL, CAN I CHANGE?

If you feel that the class is the wrong level, speak to your teacher and the Head of English. If they agree with you then you can move to a different level. Remember, we want the best for you.

## WHAT QUALIFICATIONS DO THE TEACHERS HAVE?

All our teachers are qualified with at least a degree and approved teaching certificates. In addition, we have a policy of employing those with more experience and higher levels of qualifications. We also support those who want to gain further qualifications through staff development.

## IS THERE A REGISTRATION FEE?

Yes, there is a €100 registration fee for all language learners.

## DO I PAY EXTRA FOR BOOKS?

Depending on the programme you choose you may have to pay extra for books.

- 1 -11 week learners do not pay a book fee but must return their book in the same condition received it in. They will be required to pay a €50 deposit on registration for their programme.
- 12 – 24 week learners pay a books and materials fee of €100 and keep all of the books they receive over the duration of their programme.
- 25 week learners do not pay a book fee and they keep the last book they receive. When a learner moves level they return the book they were using and receive a book appropriate to their new level. Upon completion of their programme they get to keep the book that they finish with. If learners wish to purchase the books of previous levels they may do so by paying the appropriate fee.
