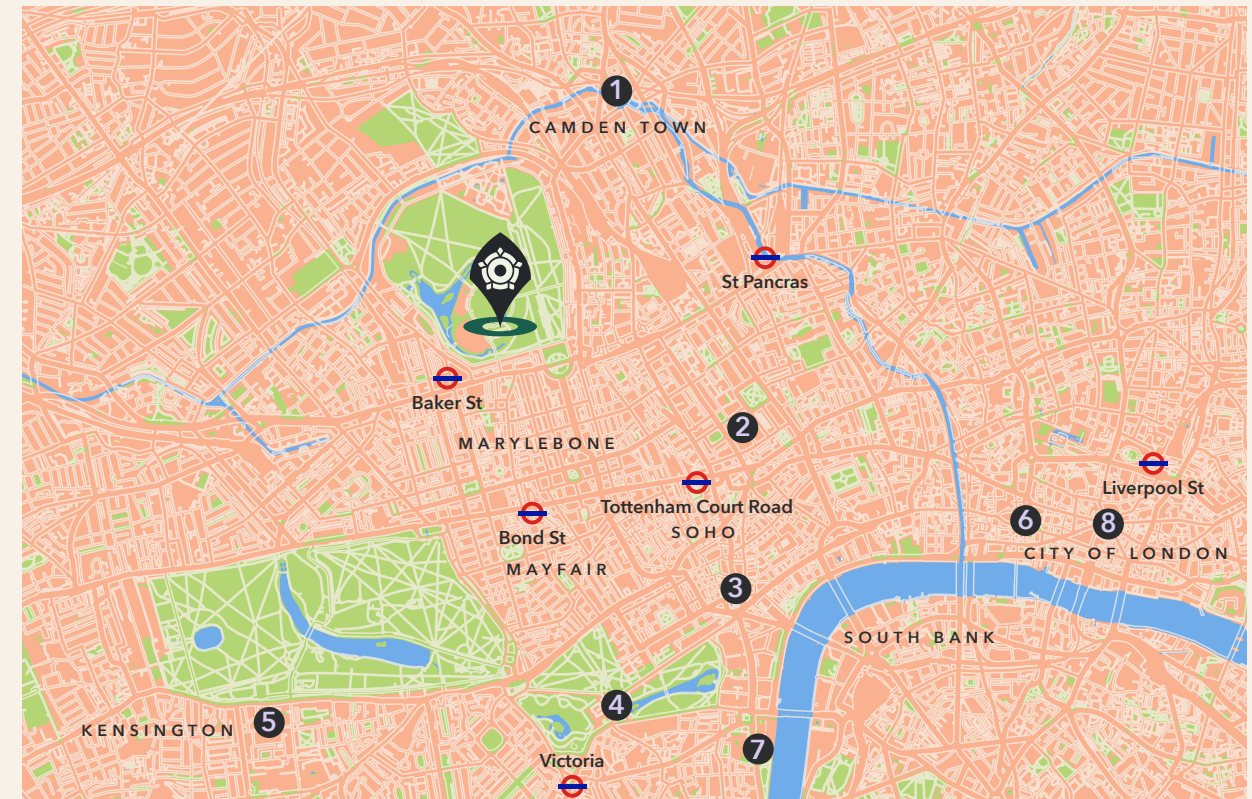

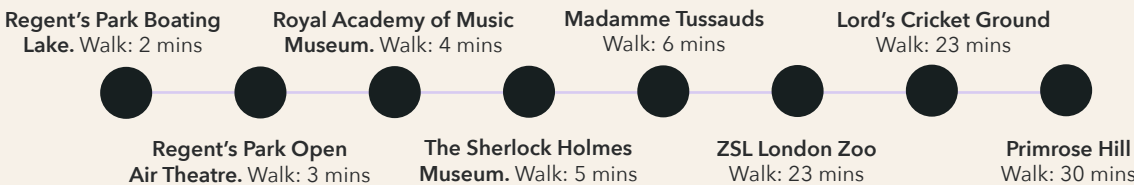


Explore the city

Tailored induction

On your first day, we will take you on a tour of campus and share all you need to know about your classes and schedule. We will explain what support, facilities and activities are available – and what you can do if you have a question or problem.

In your first week, you will meet with a member of the team to talk through your goals, identify the support you need to thrive and learn how to make the most out of your time at Regent's.

Engaging classes

Classes are always fun and engaging with a focus on practical tasks and activities that promote critical thinking, problem-solving and an understanding of British culture. Working in pairs or groups, you will put your skills into practice – presenting, writing for different purposes, and talking about topics relevant to you.

We will also take you out of the classroom on walking tours of London's top sights. Imagine discussing Shakespeare's poems at The Globe or exploring the locations Charles Dickens writes about in his novels.

Student support and progress

As part of your course, you will complete:

- A placement test prior to the start of your course
- Monthly progress tests (if your course is 4 weeks or longer)
- Monthly one-to-one tutorials with your teacher (if your course is 4 weeks or longer)
- Regular IELTS practice (if you choose General English + IELTS Academic course)
- Regular mock exams and a final exam (if you choose the Pre-sessional English course)

Year-round courses

We want you to feel confident communicating in real life situations, so our courses combine speaking, listening, reading, writing, grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation.

General English

- Monday to Friday - 09:15-12:30
- 15 hours per week
- Available at five levels: A2, B1, B2, C1, C2
- 2 weeks - 44 weeks

This course covers speaking, listening, reading and writing skills as well as grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation. Classes are practical, fun and engaging - with task-based activities that promote group interaction, critical thinking, problem-solving and an understanding of both British and international cultures.

You will be assigned to classes according to your level and typically move to the next level every 12-16 weeks. Progress is monitored through in-class activities and tasks, homework and monthly progress tests.

Intensive English

- Monday to Friday - 09:15-12:30 (General English)
- Monday to Thursday - 13:30-15:00 (English language skills)
- 21 hours per week
- Available at five levels: A2, B1, B2, C1, C2
- 2 weeks - 44 weeks

This course combines General English in the mornings with English skills sessions in the afternoons - helping you further develop your listening and speaking skills and put into practice knowledge gained in your morning class. You will be placed according to your level (A2-C2) in the mornings, while afternoon classes will be mixed level.

General English + IELTS Academic

- Monday to Friday - 09:15-12:30 (General English)
- Monday to Thursday - 13:30-15:00 (IELTS Academic)
- 21 hours per week
- Available at four levels: B1, B2, C1, C2
- 2 - 44 weeks

The International English Language Testing System (IELTS) is a widely recognised proficiency test, used for academic and immigration purposes. It is typically required for university admission.

Designed to develop the language skills, strategies and techniques you will need to be successful in your exam, this course combines General English classes in the mornings with IELTS exam preparation in the afternoons. Regular practice tests are taken on this course. The official exam isn't included, but we will help with registration.

You will be placed according to your level (B1-C2) in the mornings, while afternoon classes will be mixed level.

General English + Business English

- Monday to Friday - 09:15 -12:30 (General English)
- Monday to Thursday - 13:30 -15:00 (Business English)
- 21 hours per week
- Available at three levels: B2, C1, C2
- 2 - 44 weeks

This course combines General English in the mornings (reading, writing, listening, speaking, grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation) with Business English in the afternoons - developing your ability to communicate confidently in the workplace. You will cover job applications, interviews, business emails, presentations and more - ideal for anyone at an early stage in their career or preparing for a career change.

You will be placed according to your level (B2-C2) in the mornings, while afternoon classes will be mixed level.



Pre-sessional English

- Monday to Friday - 09:15-12:30 (General English)
- Monday to Thursday - 13:30-15:00 (Academic English and exam preparation)
- 21 hours per week
- Available at five levels: A2, B1, B2, C1, C2
- 6 - 34 weeks

This course is designed for students who currently hold an offer for a degree at Regent’s. It is available at various lengths, depending on your level of English and the entry requirements of your course. You will start with Intensive English classes, and - in the last 12 weeks - you will combine General English in the mornings with Academic English and exam preparation in the afternoons. You will take two mock exams throughout your time with us and one final exam in your last week. Upon successful completion, you can progress directly to your chosen course, provided you’ve met the entry requirements.

- 24 hours per week
- Available at five levels: A2, B1, B2, C1, C2
- This 2-week course will run from 13 to 24 July 2026

This dynamic summer course combines General English lessons in the mornings (15 hours per week) with engaging Hospitality workshops in the afternoons (9 hours per week), offering a unique blend of language development and cultural exploration.

Morning General English classes

Students are placed in classes according to their level (A2 - C2) and develop their skills in reading, writing, listening, speaking, grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation. Lessons are interactive and communicative, designed to build confidence and fluency in real-world contexts.

Afternoon Hospitality workshops

Ideal for students beginning their hospitality studies or simply curious about the field, these six themed sessions introduce the world of hospitality through the lens of beverages: coffee, tea, beer, wine, spirits and cocktails.

Each workshop explores the history, cultural significance and service traditions of the topic, offering opportunities for discussion, demonstrations and guided tastings where appropriate. The maximum number of students in the Hospitality workshops is 20.

Whether you're considering a career in hospitality or simply want to learn more for fun, this course offers a rich foundation in beverage knowledge and a deeper appreciation of global hospitality practices.
